In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

An act To incorporate the Town of Easton

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect 1. The plantation of Drumont,
in the county of Aroostook, is hereby incorporated
into a town, by the name of Easton, and the
inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with
all the powers, privileges and immunities, and
subject to all the duties and liabilities of other
towns under the laws of the State.

Sect 2. Any justice of the peace
within and for said county, is hereby authorized
to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said
town, directing him to notify the inhabitants
thereof, by posting up copies of the same, in three
public and conspicuous places in said town, seven
days at least, before the time therein named,
to meet, at such time and place, as he shall
appoint, to choose such officers, as other
towns are authorized to choose at their an-
nual meetings.

Secd, & This act shall take effect,
and be in force, from and after its
approval
