Reminder: Registrations should be sent back to the Rec. Department via the school or dropped off at the Town Office at your earliest convenience. If you would like to register in person, please schedule with Hillary. Payments must be received with your registration form unless other arrangements have been made. Please keep this book until the beginning of November.

Due to the current border crossing regulations, the Easton Recreation Department is strongly encouraging children to get a passport card. You can apply for the card at Presque Isle or Mars Hill Post Office. The approximate cost is \$60.

Children may still cross the border (without a passport, on a school bus) with a certified birth certificate (one that is stamped by the town clerk and on official paper) and a permission slip. You must get your child's birth certificate at the Town Office/City Hall in the town where your child was born.

Another option is to take a certified copy of your child's birth certificate to any USA Border Crossing & an agent will copy and stamp with their seal.

Adults MUST have a Passport or Passport card in order to cross the border since June 1, 2009.

All children and adults will have to show proof before boarding the bus for trips that cross the Canadian border. Thank you for your cooperation with this matter!
